- Proven academic ability; aptitude to complete a challenging academic program; most admitted students have a GPA of 3.0 or higher (using a 4.0 scale)
- Proficiency in math and English (writing, reading comprehension, and speaking)
- Commitment to serve the people and country of South Sudan
- Commitment to the School of Public Service's Core Values

ADMISSIONS PROCESS
